## Vacancies for Retained/Part Time Fire Fighters

Applications are invited for retained fire fighters in the following towns:

Candidates must be aged not less than 18 years on 1 November 2011 and normal retirement age for fire fighters is 55 years.

Applicants shall possess adequate literacy and numeric skills to allow them to carry out their duties in a competent and safe manner (applicants will be required to undertake literacy and numeric skills test as part of the selection process).

An appropriate level of physical fitness is a key element in ensuring Fire-fighter effectiveness and in protecting their health and safety (applicants will be required to undertake physical fitness tests as part of the selection process). Possession of a Class C Driving Licence would be an advantage.

It is part of the Terms of Engagement for Retained/Part-time Fire Personnel that persons appointed shall **work** and **reside within a distance of 1.5 miles from the Fire Station** to enable them to function effectively.
